



ACCOMMODATION INFORMATION 2024 - 2025

Accommodation Grades

Accommodation at St Edmund's is divided into Grades. Each Grade is priced at its own daily rate. Assessments of rooms are made on an individual basis, so that rooms with shared characteristics across the whole College are grouped together into the same Grade. The 'Description' provided in the table below for each Grade is based on a 'typical' average bedroom within that Grade. Please be aware that variations with the Description can still exist because of the College's varying facilities, age of buildings and the number of different residential areas on site.

Rents

Rents for each Grade are calculated based on a daily rate and invoiced at the start of each term. Terms may be longer than a quarter (91 days) and the figures below will vary accordingly.

Descriptions give a general impression of the rooms:

- Decorative state – rooms are assessed individually and rated basic, reasonable, standard, good or new.
- Shared facilities - rooms access to living space, dining, and kitchen, and rated basic, standard, good, new.
- Rooms generally get larger the higher the Grade.
- Basic bedding will be supplied on arrival - consisting of a mattress, duvet & pillow. The College will not provide a bed sheet, duvet cover or pillowcase.
 - All accommodation include utility bills except the Geoffrey Cook Building family accommodation, which excludes council tax, and contents' insurance.

Caution Money (Deposit)

Caution Money is a deposit held against possible loss or damage to decorations, fabric and furnishings for students living in College accommodation. It is charged at the beginning of the contract period and it is fixed rate of £600. Caution money is returned at the end of the contract if the accommodation is left in a satisfactory condition and if a form (available on the College website or at the Proters' Lodge) has been completed by the outgoing occupant.

Accommodation Policy

Please note that if you are a current student and already reside in one of the room grades, we cannot guarantee to provide accommodation in the same grade or equivalent grade for the following academic year. During the booking accommodation process, you will be able to select your room of choice.

Allocation Procedure - New Students joining St Edmund's in Michaelmas 2024

Once you have met all conditions to study on a full-time course at St Edmund's College, you will be able to apply for accommodation online. You will be able to select and book the room that you want, from the accommodation that is still available. Make sure you choose the accommodation that will suit you best by doing research via our website before you apply. Once a room has been reserved, you will not be able to change the room of your selection.

The instructions about logging in and step-by-step online booking will be emailed to you once you have met all conditions to study when bookings open. You can start an application and log back in another time to complete it but please be aware that if an application is left for more than 24 hours the room selected may be released and you need to select a room again.
