

The men's match saw Cambridge open the scoring with a fifth-minute penalty from




Vaccinations alone may not be enough to protect people with compromised immune

Kimia Kamelian, a Gates Cambridge Scholar at CITIID and member of St Edmund's College is part of a team of scientists who says we should prioritise vaccine

"We know that immunocompromised individuals are particularly vulnerable to diseases such as Covid-19 because their immune systems struggle to clear infections. Vaccinations offer some protection, but our study shows that only repeated vaccinations - often four or more - offer the necessary protection."


